Amazon	1) A biologically interdependent region that may be as small as a pond or as big as the entire planet.
Buttress	2) The basic category of biological classification composed of related individuals that resemble one another and are able to breed among themselves, producing new plants or animals that share the same traits of their predecessor.
Canopy	3) The heating of the lower atmosphere that occurs when carbon dioxide traps heat that would otherwise escape into space.
Conservation	4) The second layer of a rainforest, below the canopy that includes small trees & young canopy trees.
Deforestation	5) A region that includes most of Brazil and parts of bordering French Guiana, Guyana, Suriname, Venezuela, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Bolivia - some six million square kilometers through which drains a complex of rivers.
Ecosystem	6) The preservation of natural species and environments from excessive exploitation by humans, involving help from citizens, governments and scientists.
Emergent	7) The using of products from nature in a way that will not permanently destroy them for future use; using resources in a way that allows the resources to regenerate before being used again.
Extinction	8) The soil above the stony ground which is held in place by the trees. Once the trees are cut down this soil is washed away by rains.
Forest Floor	9) The first level of a rainforest, or the ground layer, made up of tree roots, soil and decaying matter.
Greenhouse Effect	10) Because the soil is not very fertile in rainforests, the taller trees have developed special roots that give extra support for the tree, since it cannot grow the deep rooting system that such a tall tree would ordinarily need to be stable.
Species	11) A community of people who live together with a shared way of life.
Sustainable	12) An evergreen forest located at low elevations in regions between the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn characterized by abundant rainfall and very warm weather.
Topsoil	13) The uppermost layer of trees in the rainforest, which are also known as the dominants. This fourth layer consists of the tops of the tallest trees.
Tribe	14) Occurs when the very last member of any species dies out. This can be caused by the destruction of habitat, over-hunting, or a failure to compete with predators.
Tropical Rainforest	15) The destruction of a forest; the long-term or permanent clearing of forests.
Understory	16) The third layer of any forest, formed by the lofty parts of the trees. In a tropical rainforest, it is made up of flat-crowned trees.
