SOME OF THE MOMENTS EXPERIENCED

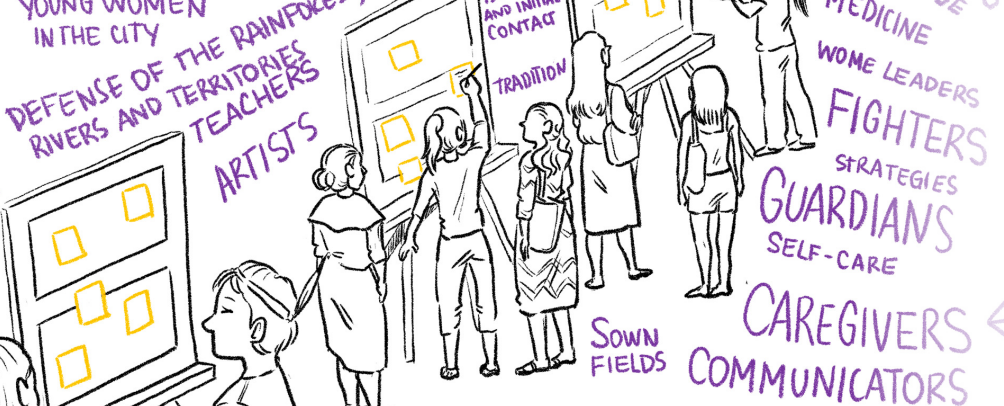
WELCOME AND CEREMONY

Honoring the territory that welcomes us, Shipibo songs and yáneshas dances were performed for the mother earth, thanking and placing our best intentions in the meeting.



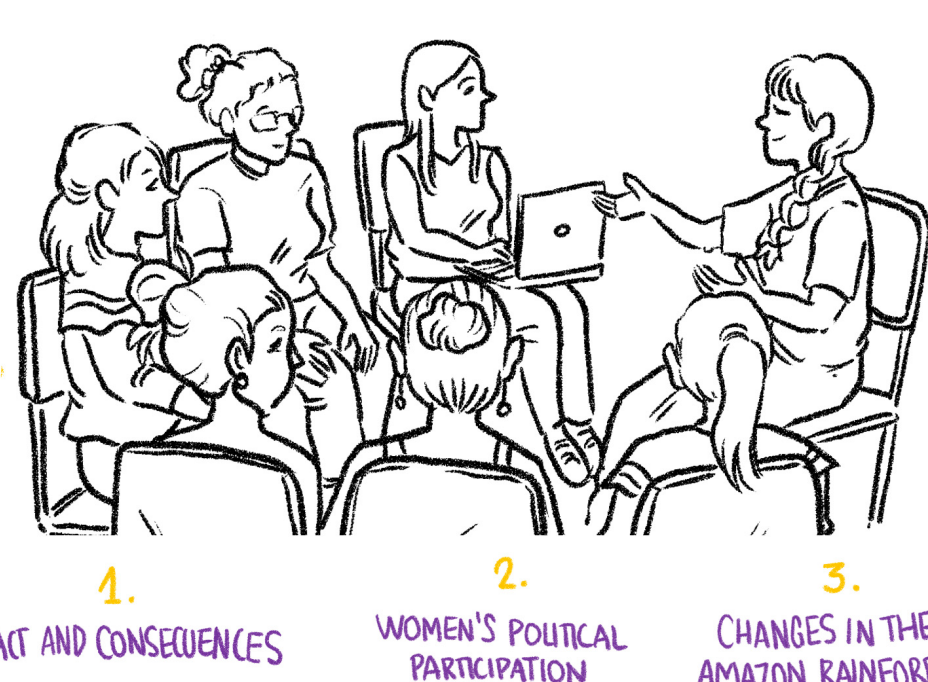
HONORING THE ROLE OF WOMEN

Through the methodology of photographic exhibition, the attendees went through the photos and recognizing the roles that indigenous women have assumed in each of these areas.



MALOCA OF THREATS

Women leaders of the peruvian Amazonian regions shared their experiences on three thematic axes: the changes that the women in the Amazon experience; the impacts and consequences of the violation of the territory experienced by indigenous women in the territory; and the political participation of women within the indigenous movement.



COLLECTIVE VISION

From a collective vision, the women identified their strengths, the threats to the territory, the threats that they experience when exercising spokespersons and the strategies they implement to confront the multilevel threats.



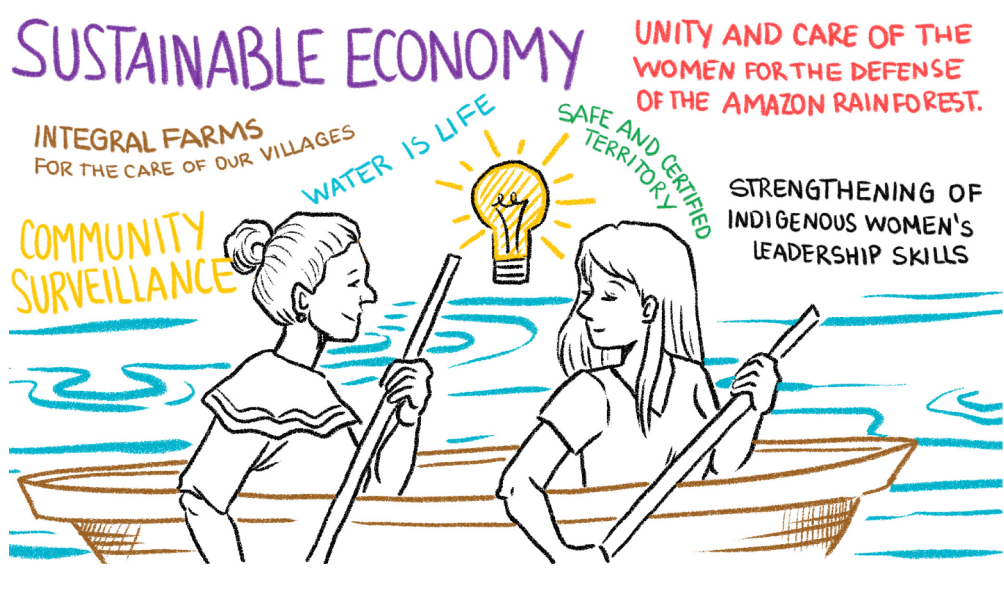
STRATEGY FAIR
